AFSAAP was formed in 1978 to promote a wider understanding of Africa. The Association produces a newsletter three times a year, sponsors an annual conference, and seeks to sponsor African visitors, promote African studies in schools and tertiary institutions, and increase the general awareness of African issues. It maintains contact with relevant governmental bodies, e.g. the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and the Australian Development Assistance Bureau, with Members of Parliament, with non-governmental aid organisations, and with other interested individuals and community groups.

The first edition of this Directory appeared in 1979 and the second in 1984. This third edition lists some 185 people in Australia, New Zealand and Papua New Guinea who have an interest in African studies. The majority are university teachers, but the list also includes diplomats, aid officials, schoolteachers, librarians, and research workers. The Directory is being issued both to facilitate contact among Africanists and to inform the media, government, libraries and other interested parties of people knowledgeable about Africa.
